Passports and Visas:

Citizens of the United States must have a passport valid for six months beyond your travel dates with at least two blank facing pages. If you do not have a passport, please apply now!

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Health Considerations:

Make an appointment with a travel clinic. There are no immunization requirements for travel to Chile, however your local travel clinic may have recommendations for you based on your age, health, and past vaccination history.

Money:

The currency of Chile is the Chilean Peso. As of May, 2017, US\$1 = CLP 675.73. US Dollars are not accepted. We recommend exchanging money in Santiago to get the best exchange rate. Credit cards are accepted in most larger shops and in cities. ATMs are in larger cities only.

Note: The recent trend in travel is for travelers to finalize their plans much closer to departure time than was customary in the past. While we try to be as flexible as possible booking last-minute registrants, we must release hotel rooms two to three months prior to departure! Please keep this in mind when making your travel plans.

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Packing Considerations: November in Chile is springtime. Average temperatures during your trip will range from 48°F at night to 88°F during the day. Rain is unlikely, but you should be prepared for a stray shower. Dress can be casual for your Chile adventure, though you may want something slightly nicer for your welcome dinner.

DAY 1

Monday

Arrive in Santiago

Santiago is a dynamic and contemporary metropolis located in the heart of Chile's fertile central valley. Chile's capital is a vibrant city full of character, with a thriving arts culture, trendy restaurant scene, and lively nightlife.

Pick-up and Transfer

You will be picked up at the Santiago airport by your guide and transferred to your hotel.

Explore Santiago

In the afternoon, head to the local market, Tirso de Molina, for lunch followed by a walking tour of historical Santiago. This tour will take you to the city's most important historic and cultural sites including Barrios Lastarria and Paris y Londres, La Moneda (Presidential Palace), Plaza de Armas, and Mercado Central (Chile's largest fresh seafood market). Another highlight is Cerro Santa Lucia, which marks the spot where conquistador Pedro de Valdivia founded the city of Santiago, and has a wonderful view of downtown.

Welcome Dinner

Enjoy a welcome dinner at Restaurant 99, known for its ever-changing tasting menus based on the seasonal and locally-sourced ingredients of the day. This meal with wine pairings will be guided by one of the winemakers, Toronto-born Derek Mossman and his wife Pilar. He is one of the spokesmen and original twelve members of MOVI (Movimiento de Viñedos Independientes: an organization which groups together some of the best independent winemakers in the country), and he makes his own label, Garage Wine Co. Throughout the evening he will carefully select a set of wines that he thinks goes well with the meal at hand, but he will never dictate to you which wine goes with which dish. You can repeat wines and go back to wines sipped earlier in the meal. Expect to have a selection of stemware at your place setting as you participate in building your own personal pairing, with Derek's skillful guidance.

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Santiago

Chile's move toward cool-climate viticulture began 25 years ago when innovative winemakers dared to suggest planting in the pre-coastal region of Casablanca Valley. Chardonnay continues to reign, but Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir – two of Chile's most attention-grabbing varietals – are on the rise. In general, parts of Casablanca Valley are similar to California's wine-producing regions. More specifically, the climate of Casablanca is comparable to the Californian wine region of Carneros.

Kingston Winery Tour and Tasting

Drive about an hour from Santiago, and begin your biking adventure at the winery Kingston. Since its first vintage in 2003, Kingston has been turning heads with its small production of Pinot Noir, Syrah, and Sauvignon Blanc. While coastal Casablanca is known for its white wines, Kingston is pioneering the production of cool-climate, artisan-style reds.

Lunch

Hop back on your bike and pedal to Matetic Vineyards where you will enjoy lunch. A state-of-the-art winemaking facility, Matetic is designed to complement its beautiful natural surroundings. The winery incorporates organic agricultural practices and design that optimizes vinification.

Casa Marin Tour and Tasting

After lunch, pedal towards Casa Marin winery. Casa Marin is a family-owned winery in Chile's San Antonio Valley and is Chile's most coastal vineyard, located just four kilometers from the Pacific shoreline. Founded in 2000 by Chile's first female vineyard owner, Maria Luz Marín, Casa Marín has been described as one of the "most daring and innovative" vineyards in the country.

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DAY 3

Wednesday

Santiago to Easter Island

Considered the most remote island on Earth, Easter Island (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) sits more than 2,300 miles from Chile's coast. This Polynesian island is filled with unexplained traditions and mystifying archaeology, including the world famous giant stone statues called Moai. There are an estimated 1,000 Moai scattered across the island, some having been transported up to ten miles from the volcanic quarries in which they were carved.

Fly to Easter Island

Fly from Santiago to Easter Island this morning. Upon arrival to the Mataverí airport, you'll be met by your local guide Josefina Nahoe. "Josie" is the daughter of a Chilean father and an American mother and granddaughter of American archeologist William Mulloy who's responsible for the majority of archeological restoration on the island. Josie offers unique perspective, insight, and personal history to Easter Island.

Relax at Your Hotel

Arrive at your hotel on Easter Island. Spend the rest of the day relaxing at the hotel, or exploring the grounds and surrounding area.

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Easter Island

The ceremonial village of Orongo is one of the most visually spectacular sites on the island. On one side of the village you see the beautiful caldera of Rano Kau and on the other you see the ocean and the mysterious islets of Motu Nui, Motu Iti, Motu Kao Kao. Orongo is the best site to view the petroglyph carving of the island. This site is yet another site restored by Dr. Mulloy in 1976.

Trekking in Orongo

Start walking from the hotel south along the coast, visiting the restored Ahu Tatau Vave located at the working port of Hanga Piko. As you continue toward the extinct Rano Kau volcano, stop at the cave of Ana Kai Tangata to view the remnants of ancient painting of the “manutara.”

Once you leave Ana Kai Tangata, you will hike through the manavai gardens of the National Park administration center. Enjoy a magnificent view of the island and its distinct geological features as you ascend the crater. At the end of the trail, arrive at an outlook with a breathtaking view at the crater lake of Rano Kau. The hike will follow the crater’s edge until you arrive at the ceremonial village of Orongo, where the birdman competition took place and you’ll be able to see the spectacular petroglyphs related to this culture and the three islands situated opposite the coast.

Finish Your Hike

After the visit to Orongo, continue hiking around the entire crater. The path will eventually give way to a view from the sector of Vai a Tare. From Vai a Tare, descend the south-east side of the volcano arriving at your final site: the ruin of the Ahu Vinapu whose whose stone work is compared to work found in Cuzco, Peru.

Rest at Your Hotel

Rest at your hotel this evening after an exciting day of exploration.

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DAY 5

Friday
11/9/18

Easter Island

Ahu Akivi is often noted to be the only platform whose Moai look to the ocean. Here you will learn the possible explanations for this special orientation as well as see the very first restored Ahu on the island. Ahu Akiv was restored in 1960 by Dr. Mulloy and his colleague Gonzalo Figueroa. It is the only platform on the island which was restored without the use of any machinery but instead using what is believed to be the “traditional” way of raising the Moai.

Biking at Ahu Akivi

Today you'll be touring parts of Easter Island on bike. Start from the hotel and head toward the restored archeological site of Tahai. After visiting the three beautifully restored platforms of Tahai, you will continue along a rocky unpaved road to visit the lava tube caves of Ana Kakenga and Ana Te Pora. From here, you'll continue along the path until you reach the unrestored site of Ahu Tepeu where you will see the largest hare paenga, or boat house foundation, found on the island. You'll also see Ana Te Pahu, Ahu Akivi, and Puna Pau, and enjoy a boxed lunch along the way.

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DAY 6

Saturday
11/10/18

Easter Island

Anakena is the larger of only two white sand beaches that are found on the island. It is also the legendary landing spot of the first king, Hotu Matua, and noted to be the center of the royal clan territory called the Miru. At Anakena you will not only have the opportunity to swim but also to visit more restored Ahu. The Ahu Ature Huke with its single Moai is noted to be the very first Moai on the island to be re-erected on top of its Ahu. This was done not by archeologists but by the islanders themselves in order to prove that they had retained the knowledge of how to move the Moai. Also, The Ahu Nau Nau has some of the most “perfect” Moai of any restored Ahu of the island.

Trekking the Northwest Coast

Drive along the west coast until you reach the area of Ahu Tepeu. From there, walk along the untouched northeast coast, visiting several unrestored Ahus and spotting petroglyphs until you arrive at the Anakena beach where you will begin your trekking adventure. This trek in total will take you approximately six hours. Enjoy a swim at the white-sand beach and then get picked up and driven back to the village.

Easter Island to Santiago

Founded in 1541, Santiago has been the capital city of Chile since colonial times. The city has a downtown core of 19th-century neoclassical architecture and winding side-streets, dotted by art deco, neo-gothic, and other styles. Santiago's cityscape is shaped by several stand-alone hills and the fast-flowing Mapocho River, lined by parks such as Parque Forestal. The Andes Mountains can be seen from most points in the city.

Fly to Santiago

Leave Easter Island and fly back to Santiago. You will be met at the airport and transferred to your hotel.

Enjoy the evening at your hotel. You might want to explore the local restaurants on your own for dinner.

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Santiago to the Maule Valley

The Colchagua Valley has long been celebrated for its ripe and juicy red wines. Cabernet Sauvignon continues to hold the lead, although these days Syrah and Carménère routinely steal the show. Recently, vineyards in the Colchagua Valley have begun planting further toward the coast and broadened the repertoire of fine wines to include cool-climate varieties.

Casa Silva Winery Tour

Begin your adventure into wine culture and the wine valleys of Colchagua and Maule. Your first stop is at Los Lingues Hacienda where you'll get geared up to start biking toward Casa Silva winery. Now in its fifth-generation as a family-run winery, Casa Silva strives to be a leader and innovator in a new generation of premium wines in Chile while maintaining a lifestyle which honors the people, traditions, and environment of the Colchagua Valley.

Arrive in the Maule Valley

Head to the Maule Valley. Soak in the hot tub at your hotel while your asado (Chilean barbecue) is being prepared for dinner.

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DAY 9

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The Maule Valley

Chile's largest and most diverse valley, the Maule Valley, is composed of three distinct sectors. The variety of wines produced in this valley allows bright, fruity reds from noble stock as well as unique wines made from the fruit of ancient bush vines that for many years were used for homemade table wines, but not generally showcased by seasoned winemakers. These wines, made from grapes such as Carignan and Uva País have caused many critics to rethink their opinion of these so-called rustic varietals.

Gonzalez Bastias Tour

After a delicious southern-style breakfast at Casa Bouchon, make your way to Gonzalez Bastias vineyard where you'll partake in a tour, tasting, and lunch. This rustic winery is located in a fairly remote section of the Maule Valley. It is reached by dirt roads, and is situated on the north shore of the eponymous river. It retains a sense of yesteryear, in the thick-walled construction of the winery, and at times in the vinification process, that even uses traditional mats made of the bamboo-like coligüe to destem the grapes, rather than machinery.

Bike Through Vineyards

Enjoy a tranquil bike ride through the Casa Bouchon property and the surrounding vineyards. Pass through the different varietals including Cabernet, Carmenere, and Petit Verdot, and arrive to overlook the 150 old Pais vines for a special tasting.

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DAY 10

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Maule Valley

The Maule Valley lies at the southern end of the Central Valley and is one of the coolest wine producing areas in Chile, although the Maule River flowing east to west has a moderating effect on the climate. The river also provides the different alluvial soil types found around the region, which included granite, red clay, loam and gravel. On the slopes where the vines grow, the soils are free-draining and more fertile on the valley floor.

Erasm Vineyard

Begin your bike ride to Erasm vineyard, where you'll enjoy a tour, tasting, and lunch. Owned by Count Francesco Marone Cinzano, who also has ties to well-known vineyards in Tuscany, Caliboro produces a single label, Erasm. This wine is an estate bottled, dry farmed Cabernet Sauvignon/Merlot/Cabernet Franc blend produced from a single vineyard on the ancient estate of la Reserva de Caliboro.

Farewell Fiesta

Have a farewell dinner with your new AdventureWomen friends. Reminisce over all of the memories you have made and celebrate the end of an incredible trip!
