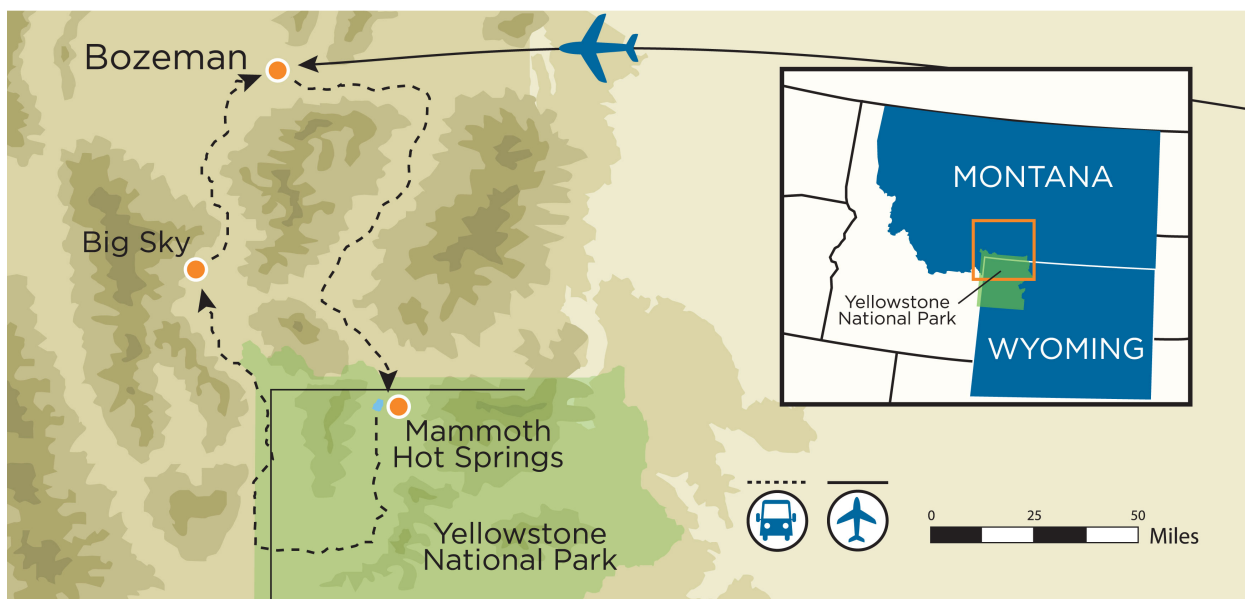

Arrive in Gardiner

Welcome to Montana! Gardiner is a small town that serves as a main entrance to Yellowstone National Park. The town got its name from a fur trapper who operated in the area in the early 1830s.

During your Yellowstone adventure, you'll get to know your expert Montana-based guide, who will help you discover this amazing, natural, wonderland. You are also accompanied by an AdventureWomen Ambassador, committed to helping make your experience a fun and personally rewarding adventure, and cheering you on as you reach beyond your comfort zone to take on new challenges in your own unique way!

Arrive at the Best Western Plus Grantree Inn in Bozeman today before 1:00pm.

Pick-up and Transfer

You will be picked up at 1:00pm from the GranTree Inn and transferred to Gardiner, Montana.

Explore Mammoth Hot Springs

Head to Mammoth Hot Springs to explore the unique and famous "travertine terraces." This is an amazing area to discover; the terraces were created over thousands of years. As hot water from the springs cools, it deposits calcium carbonate, which created this stunning landscape.

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DAY 2

Yellowstone National Park

Yellowstone National Park is in Montana, Wyoming, and Idaho, and was the first national park in the United States, established in 1872. It is known for its wildlife and geothermal activity. Its 3,468 square miles includes lakes, canyons, rivers, and mountain ranges, and it is home to hundreds of species of mammals, birds, fish, and reptiles, including the oldest and largest public bison herd in the United States.

Wildlife Viewing in the Lamar Valley

Head to the Lamar Valley in the northeastern part of Yellowstone National Park, where you can view wildlife with binoculars and a spotting scope, and have an overview of the local history and geology, as well as the ecology of the wolves, bison, elk, coyotes, birdlife, and other animals in Yellowstone. Enjoy a bagged lunch on the road today.

Hike in the Northern Range

This afternoon's hike will take you through rolling sagebrush habitat and along cold mountain streams where wildflowers abound. Look carefully as you hike and find bear, moose, and maybe even wolf tracks.

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DAY 3

Yellowstone to Big Sky

Big Sky, in the southwestern corner of Montana, is just miles from Yellowstone National Park. Big Sky offers unlimited access to outdoor recreation: whitewater experiences, blue ribbon trout streams, backcountry hikes, meandering wildlife, and widespread wildflowers.

Norris Geyser Basin

Depart Gardiner this morning and drive through prime grizzly bear habitat to Norris Geyser Basin, home to Steamboat, the world's tallest active geyser.

Grand Canyon of Yellowstone

Continue on to the Grand Canyon of Yellowstone, one of the most geologically spectacular sites in the Park. Today's hike will take you to backcountry mud pots, where boiling mud bursts from the earth. See the grandeur of Lower Falls from several viewpoints as you hike the rim of the Canyon.

Settle in at the Ranch

Check in at the historic 320 Guest Ranch. Settle into your cozy log cabin before joining your group for dinner.

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DAY 4

Big Sky

Enjoy another day in the stunning Big Sky area. The landscapes here will take your breath away.

Geysers and River Hike

Head out early and journey to the heart of the Yellowstone Super Volcano. Look for bison, elk, and coyote, and see the greatest concentration of geysers in the world. Hike along the Firehole and Madison Rivers where you can see birdlife that includes trumpeter swans, bald eagles, and a variety of ducks, geese, and possibly water ouzels. Continue to Fountain Paint Pots and Biscuit Basin and see the sights at Old Faithful. If you're lucky, you'll catch a glimpse of Old Faithful geyser erupting! Continue hiking past some of the most visually stunning hot springs in Yellowstone.

Wagon Ride

Enjoy a classic wagon ride as horses skillfully guide you through the countryside.

Dinner

Take part in a "mountain-to-mouth" catered dinner, while savoring the local flavors. All foods have been sourced from local Montana gardens and ranches.

Big Sky

Yellowstone, the World's First National Park, was created to preserve for all time the essence of this wilderness with its fragile thermal wonders that struck awe in the hearts of early explorers, and to provide a safe habitat for its wildlife to roam. Even on the borders of the park, you'll feel how wild and immense the landscape is.

Note About Today

Your group will split in two today - half of you will fly fish in the morning and horseback ride in the afternoon, and the other half will do the reverse.

Fly Fishing Lesson

Try your hand at fly fishing in the very river that made Brad Pitt famous in *A River Runs Through It*. Receive personal instruction from your professional fly fishing guide who will help you tie your flies on, untangle your knots, perfect your cast, and even take your fish off the hook during your catch-and-release fishing lesson!

Horseback Riding

Hop on one of the loveable horses at the 320 Guest Ranch. Bring your inner cowgirl into the saddle and wind through forests, meadows of wildflowers, and along the banks of the Gallatin River.

Big Sky to Bozeman

Say goodbye to Yellowstone today and drive to Bozeman, the fourth-largest city in Montana. Founded in 1864, the town's fertile land attracted permanent settlers. Today, Bozeman attracts residents and visitors for quality of life, scenery, and recreation.

Headwaters Hike

Hike along the headwaters of the Gallatin River, through meadows of wildflowers, where moose, bears, and wolves have roamed for thousands of years. Hear tales of the Bannock and Shoshone Tribes, who once walked the same trail you will be on. Experience the vastness and soak in the wildness of this treasured and protected place we call Yellowstone. End the afternoon under the big skies on a horse drawn wagon ride in the history-rich Gallatin Valley as you reflect on your stories from the week.

Return to Bozeman

Head back to Bozeman and check into your hotel.

Farewell Dinner

Have a farewell dinner with your new AdventureWomen friends. Reminisce over all the memories you have made and celebrate the end of an amazing journey through this truly spectacular area.

Yellowstone River Motel

Yellowstone River Motel is located just outside the North entrance to Yellowstone National Park in quiet, quaint Gardiner, Montana. The motel overlooks the Yellowstone River which can be enjoyed from the beautiful patio. Often, elk, antelope, deer, and other park animals can be seen across the way.

320 Guest Ranch

In 1898, when the west was wilder, two homesteads totaling 320 acres were combined to form the 320 Ranch. In 1936, Montana's first woman doctor and first pathologist, Dr. Caroline McGill, purchased the working cattle ranch as a rest and relaxation retreat for her friends and patients. Today, picture a quiet place, just north of Yellowstone Park and just south of Big Sky Ski Resort, where the pristine Gallatin River winds through sage and towering pines, snow-covered mountains rise against crystal-clear blue skies, and there's an abundance of pure, clean mountain air! That's where you will find the 320.

Grantree Inn

Cradled between the Bridger, Gallatin, and Spanish Peaks mountain ranges, the Best Western Plus Grantree Inn offers perfect lodging that is conveniently located near restaurants, shops, and Historic Downtown Bozeman. Each large, non-smoking room is attractively decorated and has one king-size or two queen-size beds, cable TV and pay movies, data ports, voicemail, high-speed internet access, clock radios, hairdryers, coffee/tea makers, irons and ironing boards, and two phones with dual lines. Excellent amenities include a heated indoor pool, hot tub, exercise room, convenience store, gift shop, a business center, and the Grantree Bar & Grill.
