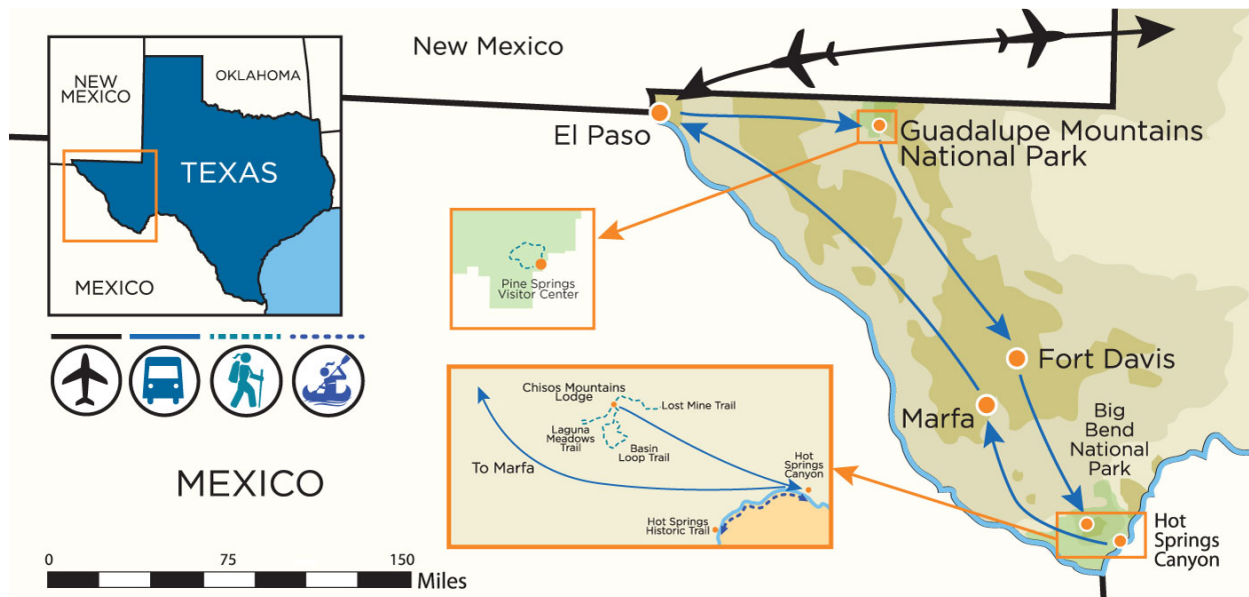

### Arrive in El Paso, Texas

As its name suggests, Big Bend National Park is a stretch of land that is located in the big S-shaped bend in the Rio Grande river along the border between the United States and Mexico. The park is a study in geographical contrasts with desert, canyons, and vegetation spread throughout the area.

#### Arrival Information

Arrive in El Paso, Texas (ELP) at any time today and make your way to the Hampton Inn & Suites El Paso Airport Hotel on your own. You will have the day and night to get some rest or explore El Paso on your own.

### Guadalupe Mountains National Park

The McDonald Observatory is an astronomical facility within the University of Texas, Austin that is one of the nation's leading research centers for astronomy. The extremely dark night skies make for excellent stargazing conditions for scientists, students, and visitors alike.

#### Pick Up and Transfer

Following breakfast buffet at the hotel, meet your guide at 7:30AM Mountain Time in the hotel lobby and set off on a 2-hour drive to Guadalupe Mountains National Park, which is just over the time zone into Central Time.

#### Drive to Fort Davis

Following lunch, you'll head out on a scenic 2-hour drive with expansive views of West Texas en route to the historic town of Fort Davis. Established in 1854, Fort Davis is the highest elevation town in the state of Texas at 5,050 feet above sea level.

#### Hike in Guadalupe Mountains National Park

After making sure your watch is set one hour ahead for Central Time, you will set off from the visitor center at Guadalupe Mountains National Park for a hike around the trails before enjoying a picnic lunch.

#### Check In and Dinner

After arriving at the hotel, check in and relax a little before enjoying dinner with the group.

#### Stargazing

Later this evening, you will take a quick drive to the McDonald Observatory at the University of Texas, Austin where you will participate in one of their famed star parties along with the general public. Take a tour of the constellations and observe an assortment of planets and stars through various telescopes before heading back to the hotel.

### Guadalupe Mountains National Park to Fort Davis

Fort Davis is home to a historic calvary post where the men who were known as Buffalo Soldiers were stationed during the second half of the 1800s to protect emigrants during the western expansion of the United States.

#### Hike through Fort Davis Historical Site

Get a glimpse of life in the frontier of West Texas and learn more about the native plants of the area as you explore the Fort Davis Historical Site.

#### Fossil Discovery

Drive south as you make your way toward Big Bend. About 2 hours into your journey, you will stop at the Fossil Discovery Exhibit where you will see the astonishing Quetzalcoatlus northropi, the world's largest known flying creature which had a 36-foot wingspan and weighed over 500 pounds!

#### Visit Terlingua

After a picnic lunch, drive another hour to Terlingua, a former mercury mining town that became a ghost town when the price of mercury collapsed in 1947 and the mines closed. In the 1960s, it experienced a renaissance when artists, musicians, naturalists, and river guides moved there and tourism reshaped the local economy.

#### Check In and Dinner

Check into your hotel and then head to the nearby Starlight Theater Restaurant, and adobe structure built in the 1930s as the Chisos Movie Theater. When the mines went bust, the roof materials were sold for scrap, leaving only the adobe walls intact. The roofless adobe building became a gathering place for open-air parties, concerts, and plays, thus the Starlight Theater was named. In 1990, the building was restored - including a new roof - but the adobe walls still remain.

### Fort Davis to Big Bend National Park

The Santa Elena Canyon is the most majestic within Big Bend National Park. The towering stone walls can be seen for miles as the Rio Grande abruptly changes direction.

#### Hike in Santa Elena Canyon

After breakfast this morning, drive an hour to Santa Elena Canyon, one of the most dramatically beautiful locations within Big Bend National Park with cliffs of up to 1,500 feet forming the canyon walls. Enjoy a short hike here before driving an hour to the Panther Junction Visitor Center to get oriented within the park that stretches from the shores of the Rio Grande to the top of the Chisos Mountains.

#### Another Hike before Dinner

Spend the afternoon relaxing at the hotel which will be home for the next two nights or setting off on a hike along the Basin Loop Trail before enjoying dinner with the group at the lodge.

### Big Bend National Park

Located in the heart of Big Bend National Park, the Chisos Mountains are the only mountain range in the United States that is completely contained within one national park. With the highest peaks stretching to about 7,800 feet above sea level, the Chisos Mountains offer a great setting for rewarding day hikes with great views.

**A Day of Hiking** Today is all about the Chisos Mountains, as you'll start the day with a hike to the Lost Mine which offers sweeping views of the surrounding mountains stretching as far as the Sierra Maderas del Carmen mountains in Mexico. After your morning hike, head back to the lodge for lunch. Then head back to the trail for an optional hike on the Laguna Meadow Trail before sitting down with the group for dinner back at the lodge.

**Enjoy the Night Sky** After a full day of hiking and a wonderful dinner, try to save some energy to do some informal stargazing in some of the darkest night skies in the country. See if you can find the constellations that you learned about a few nights earlier at the McDonald Observatory.

**Hiking Information** 5 miles with 1,100 feet of elevation gain and an optional hike of another 8 miles with 1,800 feet of elevation gain

### Big Bend National Park to Marfa

The Rio Grande river acts as the natural border between the United States and Mexico in Texas. At just under 1,900 miles in length, this river features areas of towering canyons, whitewater rapids, and dramatic wildlife.

#### Paddling the Rio Grande

Take in another gorgeous sunrise in the Chisos Mountains before driving 45-minutes to meet your local river guide. After an orientation about the gear and safe paddling, you will launch your canoe (or raft if the water is higher) and paddle down the Rio Grande. It's a gentle paddle with some faster sections and some stunning scenery. You will stop at the ruins of the Hot Springs Motel to explore the area on foot, eat a simple pack lunch, and enjoy a soak in the hot spring at the riverside pool. Then hop back in your boat and head down the river through the most dramatic part of the canyon. After your paddle, you can change clothes before driving 2 and a half hours to the quirky, art-centric community of Marfa.

#### Farewell Dinner

After settling into your historic hotel in Marfa, enjoy an animated farewell dinner as you share stories about the highlights of your time in Big Bend.
